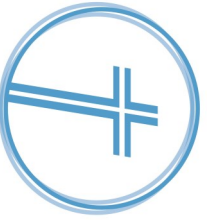

A Valued Dwelling Place

In my daily Bible reading, I recently came to 1 Kings and 2 Chronicles. I won't lie; the material can at times be arduous to get through! Even still, I think even the parts we may at times want to simply get *through* can lead us to ponder important things about our God and how much he values us.

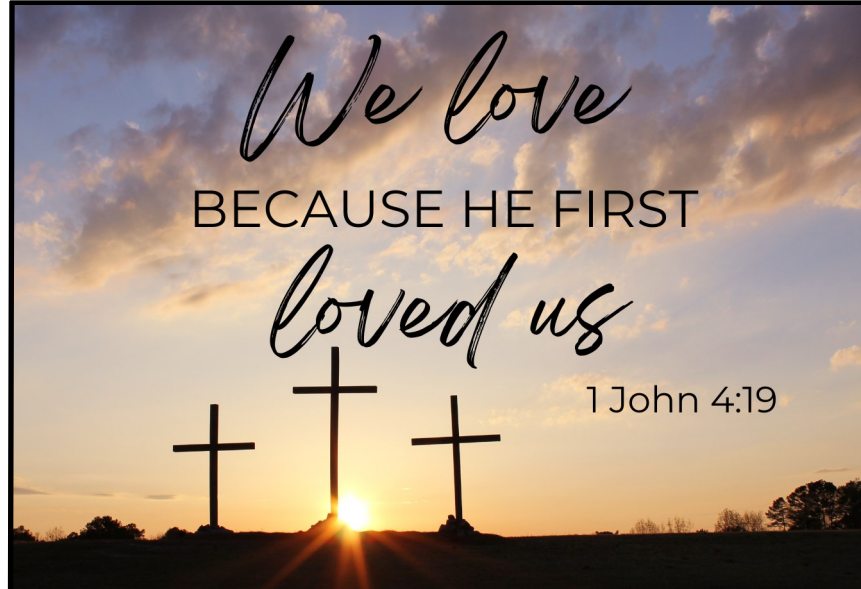
I was reading about Solomon's temple that he was called to build for God. The temple would be the manifestations of God's dwelling among his people. God had given the builders special instructions (and a lot of them!), so the temple would be worthy of his dwelling. It must have truly been a spectacle to see! Almost everything was overlaid with gold, built of the finest cedar, the most elaborate and valuable of fabrics, etc. What else would be worthy of our God but the best? God was pleased to dwell among his people.

That temple would be destroyed, eventually rebuilt (though not near the beauty of its predecessor), and destroyed again. Something so wonderful! What could replace it?

Jesus knew that the temple wouldn't be around forever. He also knew that God would still need to be among his people forever. That's why he promised that though he would leave, his Spirit would come. In *1 Corinthians 6:19-20*, Paul says, "*Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God?...So glorify God in your body.*"

If God needed his dwelling place to be of the finest cedar, overlaid in precious gold, woven of the most valuable fabric, then what do you think that says about what he has done in your heart that he would take up residence in you? Psalm 139:6: "Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high; I cannot attain it."

God is still pleased to dwell, not just *among*, but *in* his people. What do you think about what that says about how much he values you?



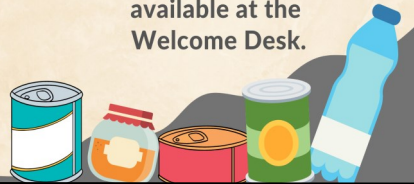
