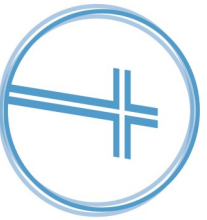

Becoming Blind

One of my favorite narratives in the gospels is the man born blind that Jesus heals in John 9. At the end of the narrative, Jesus says something to the healed man in verse 39: "For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may become blind." Jesus then turns to the Pharisees in verse 41: "If you were blind, you would have no guilt, but now that you say, 'We see,' your guilt remains."

Jesus was always turning the *status quo* on its head. He emphasized to his audience to see their need for saving (seeing their blindness). If they did not see their need, they were the blind ones. Seeing, they did not see.

There are so many principles we could take from this, but an abstract one is on my mind today. Sometimes the way we "see" most clearly is by closing our eyes and being reminded that we are blind if we are not prayerfully walking with the one who gives us new sight. The life beyond this one through which we are given true eyes to see how we are to live on in this life.

How do we have eyes to see what is real? We pray. Apart from being connected to our Father in heaven, it is a blind endeavor to try to live in this world.

It is in that same narrative that Jesus at one point states to his disciples that He is the *light* of the world. His word tells us that it is a lamp unto our feet, a light unto our path.

How do we see the path forward? We become blind and understand that we only see by turning to him—in eternal salvation, but also in daily obedience.

Are you daily remembering that you are blind without the Light?
