The Truth that Heals

Jeremiah was a prophet who was instructed by God to tell people things they did not want to hear. In a phrase, Jeremiah's life typified "the truth hurts." In his life, God's nation would be carried into exile in Babylon under King Nebuchadnezzar. Jeremiah saw in Judah rampant idolatry, hard heartedness, and a refusal to repent and turn to God. His ministry wasn't exactly revival.

God used Jeremiah as a mouthpiece to tell Judah the truth, even when it hurt. The truth was often a warning, a correction, a rebuke, or a call to return to the God they had turned away from—before it was too late.

Most importantly to the point I'd like to make today is that the people did not like what Jeremiah had to say, so they turned their ears off when he spoke. They turned their ears off to the truth.

Then one day there came along a man named Hananiah (Jer. 28). Hananiah entered into the Temple complex and spoke to a captive audience, an audience that listened. Though Hananiah claimed to be speaking what he had heard from God. Hananiah's words ran contrary to Jeremiah's. Jeremiah had claimed that Nebuchadnezzar was God's instrument to capture Judah; Hananiah claimed that Nebuchadnezzar would be defeated by God. Jeremiah claimed that Judah would suffer in captivity; Hananiah claimed that Judah would be firmly planted in the land of promise.

Now, whose message do you think was more popular with the people? What message do you think people needed to hear? Which message was truly for their healing and benefit?

God would use Jeremiah's message to humble his people and eventually heal them. But it would come through a trial. Sometimes, the hardest message to hear is the message that God uses to heal you. Yes, sometimes the truth hurts, but when the truth is from God, temporary pain gives way to lasting joy.

Jeremiah 28:15 — And Jeremiah the prophet said to the prophet Hananiah, "Listen, Hananiah, the Lord has not sent you, and you have made this people trust in a lie.

Don't trust the lie that tickle the ears. Trust the truth that mends the heart.
